Greater Brisbane

Is made up of City of Brisbane, City of Ipswich
Logan City, Moreton Bay Region and Redland City

Limiting exposure opportunities

- Limiting movement of people in, out and around Greater Brisbane
- Requiring people to stay at home except for limited permitted purposes
- Limiting public gatherings to two people
- Wearing of masks in public

Protecting the vulnerable

- Restricting visitors to aged care, disability accommodation, hospitals and correctional facilities*

*Children in hospital will be allowed parents or guardians to accompany them. Women in labour are allowed two support people and end of life visits are allowed.

Unite against COVID-19



Guidance regarding movement in and out of Greater Brisbane

- People can enter or leave Greater Brisbane only to obtain essential healthcare, for work or to return home
- Where possible people are encouraged to delay travel and remain in own suburb

Reasons for leaving home

- Essential education and work that cannot be undertaken from home
- Care or support of a vulnerable family member
- Essential shopping only
- Exercise with no more than one person not from your household
- Medical or healthcare needs, including compassionate requirements

Restrictions

- Masks are to be worn at all times when outside of your home. This includes in workplaces and public transport
- 20 people can attend funerals, 10 people can attend wedding ceremonies (no dancing or singing)
- Limit of two visitors in homes in addition to people already residing in the home
- Restaurants and cafes to provide take away or home delivery service only
- Cinemas, entertainment/recreation venues, beauty and personal care service and gyms will close
- Places of worship to close
